olynesia, of which the Hawaiian Islands are part, occupies an area triangular in shape, from New Zealand in the west and Easter Island in the east. Hawaii is the third extremity, north of the equator in the vicinity of the Tropic of Cancer. This location makes the Hawaiian Islands the most isolated archipelago in the World.

This, together with the fact that the total land area of the Hawaiian chain is less than 6,500 square miles, makes it understandable that discovery and settlement by a native population did not take place until late in the world's history – on the evidence, perhaps as late as the eighth century. Europeans came upon Hawaii as early as 1519, when it is believed that the Spaniards must have discovered the islands on their voyages from their colonies in South America to the Philippines. But accepted history credits Captain James Cook as having discovered Hawaii when he landed on the island of Kauai on January 18th 1778 and named the islands – the Sandwich Islands, after the then First Lord of the British Admiralty. Considering the vastness of the Pacific, and the enormous difficulty experienced by European explorers in sailing and charting it, a process that took them more than 250 years, the achievement of the Polynesians in locating and peopling these islands can only be described as remarkable. Since that time the Hawaiian Islands have become the playground of the Pacific from Maui's golden beaches to the island of Hawaii's (the Big Island) breathtaking volcanic scenery, Hawaii offers you both paradise and pre-history.








The Hawaiian Islands Some of our thoughts





In keeping with the other islands of the Pacific Ocean, the Hawaiian Islands hold great romantic mysticism and high expectations for the European visitor, but in our opinion much of the experience can be a little disappointing and not that romantic. 

O'ahu The gathering place







The hotel has 1150 very well appointed rooms and suites, most







The Outrigger Reef is situated right on the famous Waikiki Beach where you can swim, ride a kayak or canoe or sail on a catamaran.




elegant and typically a spacious 680 sq. feet with luxuriously appointed marble bathrooms.

New Otani Kaimana Beach on Waikiki Beach








ust 25 minutes by air from Honolulu lies Maui, the Valley Isle, so called as it was formed out of two volcanic islands that grew together forming a fertile valley between their two mountain ranges.

Sheraton Keauhon Bay Kailua-Kona



Molokai The friendly isle



Tolokai lies 8 miles to the west of Maui. The island has retained the charms of the nineteenth century and the authentic Hawaiian culture has continued, perhaps largely because half of the 7,000 population are native Hawaiians.


Molokai, the friendly isle, has a varied and spectacular landscape. The eastern shore is covered with lush tropical reserves, the northern shore is characterised by sea cliffs which soar to 2,000ft slashed by steep valleys. Moving west, the shoreline descends into remote fishing beaches and eventually arrives at Papohaku, the largest beach in Hawaii. Ancient fish ponds exist in the shallow waters of the southern shore, some of which have been restored and are now in use for fish farming.

The history of Molokai is, as one would expect, intertwined with that of the other islands. Known in olden times as 'the lonely isle', it became a haven for 'kapu' breakers ie. those who violated the ancient holy laws and is closely linked with the mystical rites of the Kahuna (Priests) and sorcery. 1830's brought missionaries to the island and with them cattle and sheep ranches.

The agricultural base is diverse and limited tourism is being developed, although the total number of hotel rooms on the island is probably equivalent to one medium sized hotel in Waikiki with most of the tourist centred on the western coast

Located at the western end of the island, built on a high ridge overlooking a large coastal plain. The hotel is set in beautiful landscaped gardens, which include a very picturesque swimming pool.

The Lodge offers 22 guest rooms located between the Lodge's main building and two eight room chalets built either side of the main lodge. The Lodge's design and warm ambience reflects the era of the 1930s, so helping to take you back to the early days of Molokai's development.

All the rooms have great views across the countryside to the Pacific Ocean, they are well appointed with all the modern facilities you

would expect from a four star hotel, however because of its location airconditioning is not required so the rooms are cooled by ceiling fans. The hotel's restaurant offers a wide selection of local and international cuisine, and it also provides an exercise room and sauna should you over-indulge.

A visit to Molokai will let you see the other side of Hawaii, trade in the beaches and sun lounges and take in the wonderful scenery, go mountain biking or horseback trekking, or you can just go walking! 
The Molokai Hotel






The Molokai Hotel is located on Kamilola Beach, which is a small black sand beach on the island's south coast.

The hotel provides good value for money accommodation, which is offered in individual chalet style buildings that contain four rooms. These buildings are set in tropical gardens and front onto the ocean. The rooms are well-appointed with private bathrooms, telephone and TV. The hotel is ideal for a one or two nights stay as a base to explore the island, however we would not recommend if for longer stays.





Lanai The pineapple island




anai lies just south of the Larger island of Molokai about 8 miles to the west of Maui. The island of Lanai is very small, originally formed by one large volcano, with an unspoilt landscape.

The island of Lanai is very small originally formed by one volcano, the landscape is steep and rugged with a central plain. Life on the island is peaceful and relaxed, there are only 30 miles of surfaced roads with no traffic lights. Since many of the roads are unsurfaced, a four-wheeled drive vehicle is probably the best means of exploring.

The north of Lanai is bordered by Shipwreck Beach, an 8 mile stretch of sandy areas and rocky outcrops. Accessible at either end by tracks, this coastline is remote.

By contrast, the southern shore is home to one of the two luxury hotels recently built on the island and also the best and most accessible beach, Hulopo'e Beach, which has long been favourite with local residents. There is excellent snorkelling and deep water swimming here.

Manele Bay Hotel



A further eighteen holes of championship golf are also available to hotel guests at the Greg Norman designed mountain course 'The Experience at Ko'ele'.












The Lodge at Koele Lanai

OVERSEAS HOLIDAYS - WHAT TO EXPECT:

One of the attractions of holidaying overseas is to see something of the culture and way of life that is different to what we are used to at home. You should not therefore expect things to be the same as in Britain - invariably this is not so. In other countries - some of which have only become accustomed to an influx of foreign tourists in recent years - the locals tend to be more relaxed in their approach to life, and this usually means taking their time over things. Also because of rapid development in some resorts the development of the infrastructure (roads, power supplies, water supplies etc.) has not kept pace with the demands of tourism. Food overseas can also be a little different to what you're used to. You may encounter unusual dishes, but try it - you might like it. OUR BROCHURE DESCRIPTIONS:

The descriptions of resorts and particularly of hotels, apartments etc. in this brochure have been complied as a esult of inspection by our staff, and we have taken all reasonable care to ensure accuracy. In using the word "hotel" we do not distinguish between other local classifications, such as "hostal", "Aparthotel", "Estalagem", "Pension", "Taverna" etc. We describe all such accommodation as hotels. For self catering accommodation, usually the description will give you a good idea what to expect, but some further explanation might be helpful:

Apartments: All villas and apartments are provided with towels, bed linen, crockery, cutlery, cooking utensils, lighting, heating and hot water unless stated otherwise. Please remember however that while your basic requirements will be provided, not everything you are used at home will be provided. For instance large bath and beach towels are not usually provided and we suggest that u take these with you. Cooking facilities are as described for the individual accommodation. Kitchenette: Refers to a small kitchen alcove which may

be separated from the living/dining area by a breakfast bar In our accommodation descriptions, in addition to stating the official classification of accommodation (where available), we also give it our own flower rating. This is our personal assessment of the accommodation and facilities which we have made, which takes into account things which may not affect the official classification, and is based upon general standards in the Country concerned. Official sifications vary, and in some areas do not exist, and we therefore hope that our rating will help you in making your

choice.

In the case of night flights your room may either be booked for the previous day to ensure that you have immediate access when you arrive - in which case you will required to vacate your room by 12 noon on the last day of your holiday; alternatively your room may be booked until the evening of your departure in which case there may be a short delay on you arrival before you have access to your room. However, where possible, and this is usually the case in low season a room will be made available for changing and storing hand luggage when you have vacated your room by 12 noon. Sometimes managements may be able to allow you to keep your room, but they are entitled to make a charge if they wish

Price Guarantee

The price of your holiday is the price quoted at the time you make your reservation. To protect that price against possible air fare increases or currency surcharges, you should make full payment to TRANSPACIFIC as soon as possible. Full payment guarantees you against any cost increases for your holiday.

If TRANSPACIFIC should be required to levy surcharges and at that time we have not received your full payment then we will absorb surcharges up to 2% of the value of the holiday, any excess surcharges will be levied up to a maximum of 5% of the holiday value. (Any increases in Government imposed taxes charges are not covered by this guarantee). All prices other than scheduled service airfares are based on the rates of exchange as published in the Financial Times.


